On Monday, May 7, 2018, by the Grace of God, Jim arrived at the Mother Teresa Center to fill out a volunteer application form. After meeting many activities. Come and enjoy your morning on the first Saturday of of the lead volunteers and getting a tour, the unthinkable happened. Jim became unresponsive and had a heart attack right in the Mother Teresa Center. By the Grace of God, CPR was started. Creative Hearts


Creative Hearts is an art program for homeless and displaced persons. We meet the second Saturday of each month at Father Carr's. Art, in its many forms, is an excellent means to build optimism. The mission of Creative Hearts is to engage homeless people in the arts and create empowerment, a sense of self and a sense of freedom.

The story of one participant exemplifies the mission of Creative Hearts beautifully. He was about 13 years old and came late to the art program one Saturday at Father Carr's. The art form that day was shaving cream art, which creates beautiful designs on paper using shaving cream and food coloring. He came to the table, but by the time he got there the shaving cream was turning mucky. I told him to add a splash of color, which he did; he chose yellow. He followed the whole process, dipping his paper in the shaving cream, and twirling it around. When he finished, he tossed it aside and walked away. I encouraged him to pick it it up and put it into a frame. I showed him what an artist he was and the beautiful piece of art he had made. His eyes grew to the size of a walnut! With a big smile on his face, he proudly walked around the room and showed his art to everyone. There are many more stories of people who have come to the Creative Hearts program like this young man and who have found a spark of hope, joy, self expression, empowerment and freedom through the projects they worked on.

Past programs have included Zen Doodles, jewelry design, a drum circle, shaving cream art, card design, ceramics and flower design. Volunteers come from noon to 3 pm and participants come at 1:00 pm. Creative Hearts hopes to expand their offerings of art forms as more volunteers and materials can be acquired. The vision is to expand to other facilities serving homeless and displaced populations by the end of the year.

Volunteers are needed on the Advisory Board which meets once a month. Specific needs are a marketing person, art teacher, volunteer coordinator and a program chairperson. In addition, volunteers are always needed to help out with each event putting out supplies, assisting participants as needed and cleaning up afterward. Supplies are also needed, such as table easels, acrylic paints, 2 long folding tables and some extension cords.

A Magical Beginning!

My name is Rajon Lynch and I am a magician. I just turned 22. This summer I will be travelling to China to start a summer magic program. I can trace the moment that allowed me to perform magic for a living. That moment was volunteering at Father Carr's. In 2015, I was 19 years old and I came to Father Carr's for a tour with UW-Oshkosh. I was amazed by the large campus and I had never seen a food pantry before. I remember Bob Lang encouraging us to volunteer if we were interested.

At that time I had not performed magic for anyone and I didn't realize I was about to have an experience that would change me forever. I had gotten a job offer to teach magic at a performing arts camp in New York. That summer, I learned many amazing tricks but when I came back I had nowhere to perform. I needed practice if I was to begin performing. I remembered touring at Father Carr's months earlier and I thought, "Wouldn't it be cool if I could perform for the kids in the Holy Family Villa Residence?" I contacted Neil Romenesko, the director of the Bethlehem Inn, and he was excited to allow me to come in and perform for the residents. The first people to ever see my routines were the children living at Father Carr's and they shaped the way I perform to this day.

The kids helped me become a better performer and I was able to show them how fun magic can be as a hobby. A special time I remember is when a little girl asked where she could learn magic. I told her to go to the library and find a magic book. The next week, she rushed to show me her book. She had already read it twice. And then she had me watch her perform every trick she could remember from the book. That was the first moment that showed me the positive effects from volunteering.

After a few months performing at Father Carr's for the children and youth in 2015, I felt confident enough with my skills to contact the local YMCA and tell them that I was a local magician for hire. The activities director of the YMCA asked if I had experience. I was able to answer yes with my volunteer experience at Father Carr's. I was hired that day for my first magic show. That was my first break, all because I got involved at Father Carr's. If you have a unique talent, consider sharing it at Father Carr's Place 2B. You never know when or how the rewards of volunteering will come. But it is worth it in the end to help the community and pay it forward.
