A Story of Hope And Recovery

Clint came to live at Father Carr's for 6 weeks about a year ago. He was at a low point in his life after ending a long term relationship, losing his job and housing and regularly abusing alcohol and other drugs. He turned to Father Carr's in his time of need and it was the beginning of some major upward changes in his life.

In the beginning, he understandably was feeling down and depressed because he was dealing with some intense losses. The chemical use intensified these feelings. Clint understood that he must commit to being alcohol and drug free during his residence at Father Carr's. "The structure at Father Carr's was the best thing for me. I was required to be back at a certain time each day and had regular meals. I felt safe and it was so nice to have people to talk to me and support me each day. I definitely would have been living on the streets otherwise." Clint began attending AA meetings on a regular basis and was determined to stay alcohol and drug free. Attending these meetings was a huge turning point but something else was also crucial to slowly building his confidence back. "I always had a dream to own my own painting business but I never took the steps to do it." Clint began painting many of the areas in the mens' shelter, Bethlehem Inn. Rooms needed painting and Clint needed to hone his skill. It was a win-win. "I started feeling good about myself when I began painting. I felt more like a man when working."

Clint initially felt extremely broken and was now steadily feeling stronger and moving toward a goal that he had never taken the time to initiate. He continued his routine of AA meetings, painting, completing chores and talking to mentors at Father Carr's for continued support. The structure and routine made it easier to stay chemical free, work hard and make decisions leading to a better future. After 6 weeks at Father Carr's, Clint obtained a job in Milwaukee with a painting company. Having steady employment was another leap toward independence but he yearned for something more. "Speed was the most important thing for the painting company but I wanted to do a good job. I decided to try painting on my own and take steps to starting my own business." Clint began realizing his dream of over 10 years when he printed some business cards, made some signs, utilized some connections and started spreading the word. It was a little scary at first but since April he has been completely self employed and has even had to turn some people down. "I cant believe how fast it took off. During a busy

time, I was getting 2 or 3 calls a day."

For over a year, Clint has remained alcohol and drug free. His family life has gotten better. He has 3 kids that he always remained committed to but he knows that his relationships with them are even stronger now. He is renting a duplex and has a goal of owning his own home. But why stop there? "I have a goal of owning rental properties." As for advice for others in tough times, Clint says, "Set goals and follow your dreams." In addition to owning his own home and rental properties, Clint plans to grow and expand his business. But before he accomplishes those goals, he has already started giving back. He helps other addicts by sponsoring them. He is a great model to demonstrate that staying chemical free is the first step in realizing your goals. Despite living in Milwaukee, Clint comes back to occasionally help out at Father Carr's. What does he do? You guessed it, painting!

The sky is the limit for Clint and his future. It all began with 6 weeks of routine, structure and support at Father Carr's. Thank you for helping us to help Clint and the many hundreds of men, women and children that live with us each and every year.
