St. Jude Parish Donates \$32,025 to Oshkosh Charitable Organizations

On Wednesday, September 30, members of the St. Jude the Apostle Parish community presented donations of \$10,675 to each of three local charitable organizations: The Christine Ann Center, the Day by Day Warming Shelter, and Father Carr's Place 2B. St. Jude raised the total of \$32,025 through its Living the Gospel fundraiser, in which donations from St. Jude parishioners were matched up to \$15,000 with funds from a restricted parish account designated for charitable giving.
