GED Classes at Father Carr's

Father Carr's has provided a safe meeting space for Advocap's Adult Basic Education/GED program. The program has been able to continue serving adults wishing to complete a GED or improve their basic skills during the Covid Pandemic. For the past 8 months, Advocap's Adult Basic Education/ GED Program has been holding classes at Father Carr's. The Advocap Offices are currently closed to the public due to the pandemic. If you stopped by Father Carr's, you may have noticed a new group of adults studying at the Mother Teresa Center. Students have been able to continue

pursuing their hopes for a better future. Approximately fifteen students have attended classes and received tutoring since Spring, from Mark Burns, an Advocab Adult Instructor. Advocap's program is unique in that it provides one-on-one instruction for adult basic education. Classes are free to students 18 or older.

Providing hope for adults working to further their education has been extremely important. With education comes opportunities. Our hope is that these opportunities will lead to jobs, stability, safe housing and a better future. It has been our pleasure to participate in this partnership. We look forward to more partnership opportunities to better serve our community.
