

A Glimpse Into Father Carr's Food Pantry

Beginning in the fall of 2020 Father Carr's began to move to electronic data keeping; due to a generous grant from the Oshkosh Community Foundation. With the use of KMAX software, accounts can be stored electronically. In hand with the electronic shift, membership cards can now be issued to the community members that help with efficiency. This has allowed for more a clearer and well-organized grasp of the demographics that Father Carr's reaches.

Over the past couple of months many changes have been made to the Friday Food Drive at Father Carr's. Changes such as moving the food drive indoors to help our volunteers combat the cold during the winter months. Another change has been a change in hours of operations for the Friday Food Drive. While the Drive-Thru Food Drive was previously providing food to the community from 8am-11am, the new hours are from 10 am-12pm. These changes have helped in granting our volunteers more time in the mornings to prepare for the food drive.

As adjustments to the operating hours of the Friday Food Drive have continued, Father Carr's Food Pantry has still been able to provide the Oshkosh community and neighboring communities with a resource to acquire food for all that may need a helping hand. In the first three months of 2022. The food pantry has been blessed to provide its resources to over 500 households which in turn has helped over 1000 community members.

While helping hundreds of community members, Father Carr's Food Pantry has been able to extend the reach of services to surrounding communities as well. While the Oshkosh community is the city with the most predominant number of members, several members come from neighboring cities. Other cities that are utilizing Father Carr's Food Pantry include, Appleton, Omro, Menasha, Fond du Lac, Winneconne, Ripon, Berlin, on top of other neighboring cities.


