IN THANKSGIVING

When I give tours of our campus, my favorite part of our story is when I talk about our volunteers. Father Carr's Place 2B has a paid staff of 2.5 people. That's it! A good bulk of our operating budget goes directly to those in need. That said, we provide aid to hundreds of people each and every week because of our tireless volunteers. What do they do?

Father Carr's has ten acres of land, three large buildings, six garages, and almost one hundred bathrooms. We are open almost every day of the year and there is always someone who needs our help. I never have to worry about the lawn being mowed or the parking lot being plowed. The drips and leaks get fixed. The light bulbs get changed and the fire alarms get inspected. Weeds are pulled and fallen leaves are raked. Every day, pantry donations are collected and organized. Every day meals are prepared for 50+ residents. The phones get answered and people are greeted as they come through our front door. Chapel flowers and altar dressings are changed as needed. Mass is celebrated and sacraments given. Patients are seen and cared for. Prescriptions are filled. Records are kept and follow-up appointments made. Floors are mopped, toilets cleaned and rooms are vacuumed. Coffee and sandwiches are served. Over a thousand meals are delivered in one morning; three times a year. A free community carnival is put together for a couple thousand attendees. A children's Christmas program is enjoyed by 500 children that includes a Santa visit, breakfast, puppet show, and presents for both the kids and the parents. But, what our volunteers are best at is listening. If someone needs somebody to talk to, our volunteers will take the time to sit with them and listen.

Father Marty Carr built this ministry based on Matthew's Gospel, Chapter 25 vs. 31-40. Jesus told us to take care of each other. That's why we have the volunteers we have. They want to live the gospel. They want to be true instruments of our Lord's love with their own words and actions.

And the king will say to them in reply, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." Matthew 25:40

I have so many things in my life to be thankful for this year, but right on top of that list is our volunteers at the Place 2B. Thank you to all who have helped us in any way this year. **You make us possible!**

Lord Jesus, thank you for all those who live Your Word at the Place 2B. Please continue to give them the fortitude and wisdom they need to be an instrument of Your Love. May they know that You are with them always as they provide for those in need. Jesus, let us always remember that to serve others, is to serve You. Amen

Saint Francis Free Clinic

I've always viewed the season of Fall as a season of change and growth. Not only with the changing of the leaves, but the drop of the temperature, and the desire to slow down; to stay cozy at home, watching football on the couch. Sometimes a desire to change your hair color, or try a new style. To take up a new hobby because it's too chilly outside to do some outdoor activities.

For those who don't know me, my name is Emily, and I'm the Clinic Director for the St. Francis Free Clinic. I am a registered nurse, and I worked at Ascension St. Elizabeth Hospital in Appleton prior to starting here full-time.

It was a big, scary change to leave my job working as a bedside nurse to take over at the free clinic. I felt like even though I had gone through a grueling 4 years in nursing school, that it would not prepare me in the slightest to be in charge of nearly 60 volunteers, expand the hours of the clinic, and continue to grow the clinic in its services and specialties. I contemplated this career change often, wondering if I was cut out for the job. Eventually, I decided to step outside my comfort zone and take the leap.

Now, over a year later, I feel so confident in my decision to work here. It has been a huge year of growth and learning. Learning how to be a manager, how to manage conflict. Learning what a free clinic even was, and how to grow to serve our patients.



Our clinic has also grown and changed a lot over the past year. We are open Monday through Friday, and one Saturday a month consistently. We now have sleep medicine, foot care, nutrition, and other specialized care that we had never had before. We are seeing more patients than ever (over 1000 patients this year so far; averaging over 100 patients a month!)

While change can be scary and intimidating, it also can bring so much joy. Try to remember this Fall to be open-minded and ready for the next challenge.
