Fifty and Counting

Fifty! It's Father Carr's Golden Anniversary and a very special milestone. What has transpired in those fifty years is absolutely amazing. Father Marty Carr started the Place 2B in 1974 as a newly ordained priest at St. Peter's Church in Oshkosh. He embraced the role of ministering to teens, as well as his pastoral duties. This was natural since he had been a teacher and school counselor before ordination. He loved working with teens and understood the struggles they encountered.



The basement of St. Peter was the original "Place To Be" for fun and positive activities. Following a brief stint in a second location, Father Carr moved to our current site in 1980 after being granted permission from the

Bishop to be the full time priest at the Place 2B. He built a recreational center that included video games, a pizza restaurant and a roller rink. He later purchased a hotel on the adjacent property to help raise funds, and to house women that were victims of domestic violence.

In 1985, the Mission Statement announced The Place 2B Family Life Center, placing a larger emphasis on supporting families. Family counseling expanded, and retreats were held frequently to support both young and old in their formation. The one constant with Father Carr and the Place 2B was change. He frequently dismantled and constructed new buildings, in addition to purchasing numerous sites in the 1990s to help operate his ministry in downtown Oshkosh. The mission grew by serving the poor and others through shelter, a free health clinic and a food pantry. For decades, the Place 2B was there for others, in both times of need and joy.

In 2007, Father Carr passed away from complications of diabetes. Many still remember him and the impact he had on them. We hear stories that include his inspirational homilies, eating pizza, playing Space Invaders, listening to the latest music at the roller rink, officiating weddings, being there at the passing of a loved one, praying with prison inmates, serving holiday meals, mentoring young adults, sending hurricane relief trucks; and the list of memories continues on!

Father Carr would also be proud that our Christ Centered mission for "all" continues on. Volunteers remain our foundation, and funding will always be private. Giving by others, and for others, has been a transformational model to build community. Our Mother Teresa Center and Community Cafe bring individuals and groups together to meet, eat and celebrate. We are building togetherness as we fight a world that is increasingly isolated and lonely. Hundreds of volunteers also organize family events including holiday meals, an Annual Carnival, our Children's Christmas Party and regular evening activities.

Our mission is strong and currently led by our executive director, Jim Boehm, who empowers others in their service. Jim's leadership allows us to be there for others while enabling them to become more independent. Our free medical clinic, led by Emily Hill, not only provides healthcare, but is a Wellness Center providing programs and teaching individuals to be healthy. Our food pantry, led by Hussain Sattar, helps individuals to be well nourished and make ends meet by reducing their grocery bill. Father Dave supports our residents and ministers to the community, while also offering daily mass and spiritual guidance for all who seek it. Our Life Enrichment Program for residents, supports them in full time jobs, saving money, overcoming addiction and violence, and living on their own again. In 2024, over fifty children lived with us including five who entered the world with us.

As we ask for your help and prayers for our future, we are reminded of the mother and her child who lived with us after recently becoming drug free. Your support of Father Carr's provided them a safe living space while Mom obtained a job and started working full time. Her job gave her an identity and the ability to save money for the first time. Her child was nurtured, encouraged and loved as they struggled to transition to a new school, but eventually adjusted successfully. Our clinic provided medical care when it was necessary during their journey. Our programs for recovery, money management and other needs provided encouragement and motivation. Sisters Matilda and Grace, and others loved them and helped guide them back to independence. Today they are living on their own and their future is hopeful.

Father Carr's first fifty years is full of endless similar stories offering love and support to transform lives. We ask that you pray for another fifty years of blessings.
